

### **Corrigendum for Industry/Academia sponsored candidates for admission in PhD Program**

Industry/academia-sponsored candidates preferably may complete the one-semester coursework as residential scholars at the institute. However, if it is not feasible, because of job roles/responsibilities and remote locations they may opt to enroll for the courses as non-residential scholars through mutually agreed modes, such as online classes during evenings, weekend, holidays live demonstrations, recorded lectures in consultation with concerned faculty. The fee structure for Industry/ Academic sponsored candidates who either complete one semester through residential mode or online mode will be as under:

**Note:**

- (i) For all Ph.D. students the comprehensive viva voce and thesis evaluation charges @ Rs. 15,000/- are payable at the time of thesis submission.
- (ii) Air conditioned rooms with attached toilet facility for industry/academia sponsored candidates who wish to complete first semester in residential mode can be made available, subject to availability @Rs. 4000/- per month. Those who wish to opt for hostel accommodation will be charged at par with other regular Ph.D scholars.
