# **ADMISSION GUIDELINES FOR B.TECH. PROGRAMME**

NIFTEM-K offers two modes of admission for the B.Tech (Food Technology and Management) program, offering 200 seats.

#### 1. JoSAA / CSAB 2025: 100 seats

Candidates must refer to the JoSAA/CSAB 2025 website for its application procedure, guidelines, and updates, if any. NIFTEM-K will not entertain any discrepancies or queries related to admission through this mode.

#### 2. Direct Admission (Through NIFTEM-K): 100 seats (JEE- 50, CUET- 30 & NEET-20)

Under this mode, an individual candidate must complete the registration process by applying through the link mentioned at Page No. 5.

- Out of 100 seats to be filled through Direct Admissions, 50 seats will be filled through JEE-Main, 30 seats will be filled through CUET and 20 seats will be filled through NEET as per the reservation policy of the Govt. of India. Kashmiri Migrants will be allotted 5% supernumerary seats.
- Admission process for seats in respective qualifying exam (JEE/NEET/CUET) will commence as and when the results are declared. Candidates are advised to frequently visit admission portal for latest updates.
- If a candidate wishes to apply under multiple qualifying exams (JEE/NEET/CUET) category, he/she has to submit separate application form for each qualifying exam by completing fresh application on admission portal.

#### **OVERALL ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR DIRECT ADMISSIONS**

- Candidate must be Indian nationals, Person of Indian Origin (PIO), or Overseas Citizen of India (OCIs) to apply for NIFTEM-K Direct admission.
- Candidates must have studied at least three subjects among Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, and Biology during their Class XII (or equivalent) examination.

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- Candidate should have a valid JEE Main/NEET/CUET score for the year 2025

- For candidates who appeared in the Class XII examination for the first time in 2024 and reappeared in any subject (for whatever reason) in 2025, the better of the two performances will be considered.
- If a board gives aggregate marks considering both Class XI and Class XII, then only Class XII examination marks will be considered.
- If a board awards only letter grades without providing an equivalent percentage of marks on the grade-sheet, the candidate should obtain a certificate from the board specifying the equivalent marks and submit it before the deadline for submission of documents. In case the board does not provide such a certificate, the percentage marks will be assessed as follows: Marks (%) = (CGPA or CPI obtained × 100) / PS, where, PS= maximum value of the point scale used by the respective board.

- Note: (i) Mess charges ₹25,800/- (Rupees Twenty-Five Thousand and Eight Hundred only) advance is payable per semester, which is variable, and has to be paid at the time of joining the Hostel.
- (ii) Hostel room rent is not refundable/waived off even when the student proceeds on internship or study tour or vacations.

## **ON-SPOT** Counselling

- If seats remain vacant after closing of JoSAA/CSAB 2025 admission process, the remaining seats may be filled through On-SPOT counselling. If seats remain vacant after few rounds of Direct Admissions through NIFTEM-K, the remaining seats may be filled through On-SPOT counselling.
- In On-SPOT counselling, merit list will be prepared only on the basis of 12<sup>th</sup> marks (Physics + Chemistry + Mathematics/Biology + English + one additional subject).
- During the on-spot admission process, JEE/CUET/NEET scores will not be considered when preparing the combined merit list. All candidates will be placed in the same pool, regardless of their scores. These scores will serve only as a qualifying criterion for attending the on-spot counselling as per minimum eligibility requirement for the respective exams (JEE/CUET/NEET).
- Eligibility criteria mentioned at page no. 13 will not be diluted under any circumstances.

### **Tuition Fee Waiver**

NIFTEM-K offers tuition fee waiver to students whose family income is less than 1 Lakh (complete tuition fee waiver) and for students whose family income is within 1 Lakh to 5 Lakh (2/3rd tuition fee waiver). However, it will be implemented once the student takes admission in the course.

### Note:

- i) OBC-NCL certificate should be in the prescribed format: "Form of certificate to be produced by other backward classes applying for appointment to Posts/Admission to Central Educational Institutes under the Govt of India"- (*The format of respective certificate has been attached at Annexure I*)
- **ii**) EWS/OBC-NCL/Income certificate should be valid for the financial year 2025-26, i.e. issued on or after 01 April 2025. No correspondence will be entertained to update this during later phase of the admission process- (*The format of respective certificate has been attached at Annexure II*)
